The Sound Garden Story



Frank Youngman and his kids were loading ironwood into a pickup truck when Frank noticed the wood made different sounds as it hit

the bed of the truck. They threw the wood out, laid it on the ground and quickly constructed a xylophone on the ground.

Thoughts of creating a space in the back woodlot where the family could gather, where friends could stop on cross country ski trips, build a fire and create a truly alternative musical experience soon led to a sound circle around a campfire consisting of several rustic instruments.

The Sound Garden was a "Secret Sound Garden" for a time until Frank needed a project for an independent study at Central Michigan University. He approached the independent study professor with the concept.

A few digital pictures, a website and a sound tape resulted in the approval of the Sound Garden study and this private musical experiment was no longer a secret.

Community Partners

In September 2001, Michigan Association of Community Arts Agencies issued a request for idea papers for a unique grant program called "Community Partners, Artist in Residence".

The City of Cadillac and The Cadillac Area Visitors Bureau approached Frank about creating a public Sound Garden in a Lakefront location at the Headwaters of the about to be constructed Clam River Greenway and the answer was "Yes!"

A Planning Grant dinner party was held at the original Sound Garden with the Boards of the City, the Visitors Bureau and the Gopherwood Music Society to introduce the concept. After this enthusiastic reception, the grant was written and accepted, thus allowing the Sound Garden to come alive.

In an effort to attract people to Downtown Cadillac, it was decided to build the Sound Garden instruments in the Central Business District. An old structure, the Floyd Sundstrom Building, scheduled for demolition was secured and given a last hurrah as the birthplace of the community Sound Garden. "The Floyd" is located adjacent to the busy City Park where almost daily concerts, events and activities provide traffic for the site. Curious locals and visitors drop in on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings to strip bark, hear the story of the Sound Garden and most importantly offer their ideas, their talents and their time.

The creative energies are flowing in Cadillac. Don't miss your opportunity to be part of this excitement!.
